Week 7

Tuesday- Began in Sunset Bay and found 25 plants scattered along the northern shoreline, we also found 120 plants in a shallow shoal area a couple hundred feet off shore towards the central northern part of the bay. Three plants were found between the island and shore as we worked our way north and out of the bay. A few single young plants were found along the shoreline as we progressed north towards the North Bay. Finally we found a small patch of 35 plants in the cove just to the south of North Bay point, and another small patch of 20 plants off this point.

Wednesday- We began by removing a patch of 150 plants found in the southwest corner of North Bay and another 150 plants in the northwest corner of North Bay. Working our way along the northern shoreline we removed a few scattered plants totaling 10 plants. We progressed south along the eastern shoreline finding three plants along the way, 1 near the bridge just to the south of the most predominant point in the northeast part of the lake and the other two were found in the cove directly across the lake from Sunset Bay.

Thursday- Began by heading south on the western shoreline from Sand Beach Mountain. A couple plants were found off the point directly to the south of this mountain. 10 plants were found scattered along the shoreline near the wetland area near Pine Mountain. The end of the day was cut short due to a lightning storm.

Friday- Began at the islands with the large white house in the southwest of the lake. About 15 plants were found around these rocky islands. The bay to the west of the islands yielded 2 plants. 25 plants were removed from the southeast corner of the bay south of the Point o Pines girls camp, a couple more plants were removed from the northern part of this bay as well. 10 plants were removed from the shoal off the small point just to the north of the Point o Pines camp.
